The Course

This popular, well established moorland race, now in its 36th year, starts below Haytor Rock and follows a hilly, single lap route before returning once again to Haytor Rock with a fast downhill scamper to the finish opposite the middle car park at Haytor. The course is approximately 6 miles and is challenging, with several steep ascents and descents and is generally run across rugged, open moorland, apart from two sections through woodland; firstly below Hound Tor and secondly below Haytor and includes a stream crossing.



The course is completely off-road. NOTE: Please follow the marshals instructions and any markers at all times.

Race brief.....

Race Start is at 5.30pm, please leave yourselves plenty of time to arrive, collect your race numbers from Race HQ (in behind the info centre) and get to the race start (at least a 5 min walk away).

Please adhere to the Country Code and note that dogs will not be allowed to accompany runners, nor will any following cyclists.



Being mid July there will still be some ground

nesting birds present. Please keep to existing tracks over Black Hill (from Haytor Quarry to the first aid station).

Where the course is marked (from Becka Brook up to Holwell Tor), **please keep to the track**. The course will be marshalled by experienced marshals—please follow their instruction. This event is not suitable for wheelchairs, prams or pushchairs.

Drinks will be available at Hound Tor— already poured in cups - (at approx. 4 miles) and at the finish, in recyclable bottles. First aid cover is provided by A2E. You're in safe hands!

Please be aware that the use of headphones is not permitted; anyone found wearing them will be disqualified from the race.

There is a cut-off time of 1 hour at Hound Tor; if you get to Hound Tor later than 6.30pm a marshal will put a cross through your race number and advise you that you are no longer officially in the race. If you then chose to continue running the course, you do so at your own risk.

There will be a medal for each finisher.

Numbers can be collected on the day from the race HQ which will be clearly marked.

If unsure please ask a car park marshall who will be happy to point you in the right direction.

We plan to be using chip timing again this year.

Your race number must not be folded, cut or mutilated. Please make sure you complete the medical information on the back of the number.

Prize giving will take place at the Race HQ at 7.30pm in the following categories:

1st, 2nd & 3rd Male overall;

1st, 2nd & 3rd Female overall;

1st & 2nd FU18/F35/40/45/50/55/60, 1st F65/70; MU18/M35/40/45/50/55/60, 1st M65/70;

and 1^{st} Male & 1^{st} Female team (4 to count).

How to get there ...

From A38: Take A382 north off A38 at Drumbridges roundabout (signed Bovey Tracey). Go straight over first roundabout. At second roundabout turn left onto B3387 (signed Haytor). After half a mile, turn left (signed Haytor) and continue up hill (3 miles) to <u>middle</u> (2nd) car park below Haytor Rocks.



When you get there...

Please park at the <u>middle</u> car park, (what3words—establish.yourself.sling), Haytor which isadjacent to the start/finish—parking is free and there'll be marshals at the car park to direct you. Dartmoor National Park have asked that we do <u>not</u> park at the lower car park by the Visitor Centre—there will be marshals there directing you to the middle car park. Parking in the upper car park is allowed but is chargeable until 6pm (for three hours).

Race HQ is once again in the Coach Park behind the Visitors Centre in the lower car park; the pedestrian entrance is via the lower car park. There are toilets there.

After, the race come along and enjoy tea and coffee and our famous Trotter Cakes. We're also firing up the barbeque! All can be found at Race HQ.

If, sadly, you can no longer take part, we will be accepting number transfers on the day. The new entrant should come to Race HQ from 3pm on race day to complete the transfer form and pay the £3 administration fee (which goes to charity). They'll then be given the number.
